What is an iCeGS Associate?

- An expert in an area of activity similar to or congruent with that of iCeGS
- Someone who wishes to build an association with iCeGS and become part of its intellectual community
- Someone who may work or collaborate with us
- Two roles
 - Associate
 - Senior Associate – (Nationally recognised expert within the field who works extensively with the Centre)

What does it mean to be an iCeGS Associate

- Access to a collegiate intellectual environment
- 3 dedicated associates meetings a year
- iCeGS membership (including policy and research briefings)
- Consideration for involvement in work that iCeGS undertakes
- The right to use the title “Associate” or “Senior Associate”
- The opportunity to contribute a staff page to the iCeGS website.

Benefits to iCeGS

- Association with leading experts
- Access to a pool of expertise and research and teaching capacity
- Advocates for the work of the Centre
- People who may wish to use the Centre as a partner on projects and funding bids that they are developing
- People who may wish to make suggestions about projects for the Centre and contribute to their development

The role of iCeGS meetings

The meetings provide Associates with:

- Discussion and information about relevant trends in policy, practice and research within the fields of career and career guidance
- An opportunity to network and be part of a community of practice
- An opportunity to disseminate own research and give papers
- An opportunity to find out about iCeGS work
- An opportunity to make suggestions and influence the development of iCeGS work
